Weekly Reflection.

The purpose of God's laws

The first reading from the book of Deuteronomy invites us to reflect on the wisdom, beauty, and purpose of God's laws. Moses speaks to the Israelites about the statutes and ordinances that would guide them as they prepare to enter the promised land.

For some people, the idea of laws creates fear and anxiety since it is an impossible demand for perfection; for others it is an attempt to impose restrictions on human freedom. But the first reading shows that such a disposition is not right. The 'statutes and ordinances' are not just commands issued by a superior being but represent a gracious invitation into relationship with Yahweh. They are meant to form the character of the people and prevent them from backsliding into their old and comfortable behaviours.

The text sees the greatness of the nation of Israel as the outcome of their close connection with God and the Torah (the Law). In other words, there is a link between the nearness and righteousness of God, and the nearness and righteousness of the Law. Both produce the same effects – as God gives life so does the law.

Obedience to the law becomes a pious concern for us because it is connected with obedience to God who created us in love and desires abundant and eternal life for us. The laws of God are meant to keep us close to him, save us from destroying ourselves, from destroying others and the rest of creation.

Rather than restrict human freedom, God's laws enhance it. True freedom goes with responsibility, and any form of freedom devoid of a good measure of self-restraint often leads to destruction. It is a big mistake to consider a life of reckless indulgence in immorality as a sign of freedom, because such a reckless behaviour will lead to self-destruction and the destruction of others.

So, the points for our reflections include: how do we react to the various rules and regulations we come across in the Church? Do we consider them the outcome of wisdom and the inspiration of the holy spirit or as outmoded rules without any relevance to our lives? Fr Humphrey.

Healing Mass with the Anointing of the Sick.

Today Sunday 1st **September at 4.00pm** in the afternoon, we will have a special Mass in St. Joseph's Church, Carrickmacross, where we will celebrate the Anointing of the Sick. The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is one that is underused among our faithful. The Oil of the Sick is one of the three oils blessed by the Bishop at the Chrism Mass each Holy Thursday. This oil is distributed to every priest and parish in the diocese, along with the Oils of Chrism and Catechumens, used in Baptism and Confirmation.

The Anointing of the Sick is a very special celebration which dates back to the earliest days of the Church. For many, the Anointing of the Sick was understood as Extreme Unction, to be used only in danger of death. The Sacrament is much greater than those limited occasions and is to be used as the occasion of healing for anyone experiencing sickness or ill-health.

As such we will invite all those from our faith community who wish to avail of this healing to come along on Sunday 1st September at 4.00 pm to experience the healing of Christ through this wonderful Sacrament.

We hope that those who are on the First Fridays Sick and Housebound lists will attend, anyone else who feels they could benefit from the Anointing, to come along to the celebration.
